## **Actinic (Solar) Keratoses : Guidelines for Management**

Solar (or actinic) keratoses are lesions of superficial epidermal dysplasia on sun damaged skin, usually in patients over the age of 50.

All patients should be advised to use appropriate sun protection.

Small, flat, slightly scaly solar keratoses which are causing no discomfort or distress to the patient

Strong advice on careful sun protection, patient may need to purchase emollients over the counter to use for symptomatic relief

Advise patient to report any sudden changes in appearance, size and thickness or the development of pain **Limited number** of lesions moderate solar damage

## WHEN TO REFER

- Diagnostic uncertainty
- Suspicion of malignancy (refer under 2 week rule) beware atypical keratoses, esp if lesions are tender, painful, ulcerated or growing rapidly.
- Patient on immunosuppressant drugs (e.g. post-transplant)
- Lesions that have not responded to treatment
- Very young patients
