


Endorsing 'FS' on SystemOne

SystemOne has now added the 'FS' endorsement functionality which will allow prescribers to indicate whether a product is being used for the treatment of a sexually transmitted disease (STD) and therefore should be supplied to the patient free of charge on a FP10.

This is in line with existing legislation under the NHS Act 2006, which provides free of charge treatment for STDs.

There is no specific list of products which can be endorsed with 'FS' and prescribers are asked to use their clinical discretion when prescribing items for STD treatments. This also means that the FS endorsement box will appear next to most medication on SystemOne.

It's important prescribers ensure that 'FS' endorsement is only ticked when supplying treatments for STDs.
