



1. Picking Screen Setup

➤ Formulary


- A list of medicines that are approved for prescribing with standardised directions and quantities
- List managed centrally by the BSW Medicines Optimisation Team as new medication is approved.
- Updated every **TWO** weeks
- Makes drug selection easier by sorting formulary (preferred) medication to the top of the picking list and providing common default dosing instructions in line with BNF
- The formulary will **NOT** prevent you from prescribing non-formulary medication.



- If you use TTP SystemOne, you should already have this uploaded, to check, click:
- 'Setup' → 'Prescribing' → 'Drug Formularies'
- Look for 'BSW Meds Optimisation Formulary'

1. Picking Screen Setup

-  Formulary
 - To use the formulary properly, each individual prescriber within the practice will need to ensure the formulary entry box is ticked



1. Select a test patient
2. Prescribe a new acute medication – Ensure formulary entries box is '**TICKED**'. This selection remains until you change it so only needs to be done ONCE.

- You also need to ensure you select the BSW Meds Optimisation Formulary as your default



1. Click the 'settings' tab
2. Ensure in the drop down list for default formulary you have 'BSW Meds Optimisation Formulary'. This selection remains until you change it so only needs to be done ONCE



- Lists all DM+D available items in Alphabetical order
- Sometimes very difficult to find the right product!

1. Picking Screen Setup



Formulary

- If a formulary medication  is selected, you will be able to choose from the available dose presets



- You can then select the one you want so it is highlighted then press 'OK'

1. Picking Screen Setup


-  Drug Tariff Pricing
 - You can display medication price by clicking  symbol.
 - Only needs to be done **ONCE**.



- Will provide cost information for every line (where available)
- If 'blank' or '£0.00' it is either an unlicensed or discontinued product – avoid use where possible. Definitely not 'free!'

1. Picking Screen Setup

-  Frequently used drugs
 - This comes up besides a medication if its something you frequently prescribe.
 - Your picking list can be 'sorted' according to frequently used
 - It is **NOT** related to 'formulary' and is not necessarily a 'preferred' choice
- Example **WITHOUT** Frequently used ticked



- Will still sort as per 'formulary' choices above dashed line
- Will also display 'Frequently used' list below dashed line

- Typical Issues include:
 - Has been misinterpreted as a 'preferred product'
 - Can lead to issues where preferred brands change, as will highlight previously recommended products you may have prescribed.


-  Frequently used drugs






- Type in '0' where it says 'Include items in the top % of all drugs issued'
- Click 'ok'

1. Picking Screen Setup

-  Frequently used drugs
 - To **RESET** your frequently used drug list



- Click 'settings' on picking list tab
- Click 'Configure Frequently Used Drugs'



- Can either highlight individual drugs and then select 'Reset Selected Drug History' or just 'Reset all Usage Information'

2. EPS4 and printing 'FP10s'

- EPS4
 - Basically means prescriptions will default to EPS even for patients without an EPS nomination
 - Personally administered, unlicensed/specials will still print as FP10s
 - It is still possible to 'revert to FP10' in prescription queue

2. EPS4 and printing 'FP10s'

- Reverting EPS to a FP10

Authoriser: SPENCER, Benjamin (Mr) (Pharmacist)

TP options: Routine Immediate

Nominate dispenser: Community pharmacy (Rowlands Pharmacy, Co-Operative Store, Hi...
 One-off nomination

Print tokens (optional for electronically signed scripts with a nominated dispenser)

Recurring patient counterfoil message: pod

One-off patient counterfoil message:

Scripts will be signed, and any tokens printed, later via the Prescription Search screen.

Script Printing: Select what to do with script(s)

Query Prescription: Adds a query note visible to the authoriser when signing

- Issue your prescription in the usual way, but select 'print/sign & send later'

2. EPS4 and printing 'FP10s'

➤ Reverting EPS to a FP10

- Now click 'FP10 printing' tab
- Click 'Run report'
- Right click on the relevant prescription and click 'Print'

3. AccuRx

- Allows you to send a text messages directly to a patient
- Allows for video consultations with patients
- Integrates with your clinical system and makes relevant journal entries into patients records where communication has taken place
- Can send advice, appointment reminders, test results
- Can also send attachments or NHS UK advice
- Can enable presets for common messages



3. AccuRx

➤ Using templates



- Click 'Speech' bubble

- Type 'medication review' or 'hypertension' etc under 'Template'
- Select appropriate template
- When happy with Message text click 'send and save' to send to patient and save a copy in patients records




- Issue prescription in usual way
- Re-enter patients records
- Click on 'Prescription History' tab



- Select 'relevant prescription'
- Highlight the 'ETP Barcode Number'
- Right click and 'Copy' from right hand side pane

3. AccuRx

- Sending ETP prescription number for patients without a nomination



- Click 'Speech' bubble
